The purpose of this memo is to provide details for the events and initiatives that have been organized across the District to recognize World Autism Awareness Month (WAAM). The theme this year is "Everyone Belongs; supporting inclusion and well being". The goal of the month's focus is to raise awareness and acceptance about autism. Supporting students with autism is ongoing throughout the year through many initiatives.

WORLD AUTISM AWARENESS MONTH (WAAM)

Every school within the District is being invited to showcase student inclusion, wellbeing and awareness, through various activities at their schools. Schools are reminded to incorporate their Autism Ontario Flag and World Autism Awareness Banner that they received in previous years. Learning Support Services (LSS) will be providing each school with the following items:

- Speaker Series poster to display in their schools;
- WAAM Awareness Kit that includes ideas to support inclusion and wellbeing, curriculum links, staff meeting suggestions, resources, and videos for Elementary and Secondary schools; and
- Autism Ontario Educator Toolkits.

Communications will be coordinating social media throughout the month, and schools are encouraged to share their photos and tag @OCDSB. Schools can also use hashtags like #WorldAutismAwarenessMonth and #EveryoneBelongs when they share their photos.

ASD/DD TEAM INITIATIVES SUPPORTING INCLUSION AND WELLBEING: New Initiatives:

ASD/DD Toy Bin was originally introduced to support students on the waitlist for ASD Specialized Program Classes (SPCs). Currently 71 schools across the District have a bin. There are six bins available through the lending library. The ASD/DD structured play resource bin provides play-based activities that promote the development of pre-language skills such as engagement, joint attention, emotional regulation, imitation and turn-taking.

Art of Music Program is being used in eight junior ASD SPCs with additional eight junior ASD-SPCs being introduced this spring. The Art of Music Program was a collaboration between Learning Support Services (LSS) and Program and Learning (PAL). The purpose of this program is to provide practical, relevant and engaging music lessons, resources and assessment for teachers to use with students with autism to support social, communication, and self regulation skills.
