8. <u>Matters for Discussion</u>

8.1 Report 25-006, 2024-2025 Revised Estimates (R. Gerrior)

Your Committee had before it Report 25-006, seeking to explain changes reflected in the District's 2024-2025 revised estimates as compared to the District's 2024-2025 estimates.

During discussion, and in response to queries, the following points were noted:

- No significant changes are expected to next year's funding formula;
- Potential U.S. trade tariffs will likely affect the budget, for example, funding for new capital projects;
- The District ensures that Ministry of Education funding benchmarks are being met;
- Creative solutions are actively being sought to subsidize other areas;
- The Elementary Program Review could have an impact on enrolment;
- Revenue-generating models are being considered for programs that are not currently fully cost-recovery; and
- The replenishing of reserves is important.
- 8.2 Regional Internal Audit Activities Update (G. Segu)

Genevieve Segu provided an update on the following activities of the Regional Internal Audit Team (RIAT):

• The 2023-2024 Special Education Benchmarking report has been drafted and will be issued to the Board within the next few weeks;

- Gordon Champagne has completed the 2023-2024 Safe Schools initiative and will debrief management. The survey questions and a summary of the response analysis would be provided to trustees, if required;
- The RIAT team will meet with the the District's General Counsel regarding 2023-2024 legislative compliance; and
- There are no outstanding management requests or recommendations at this time.

8.3 Audit Committee Annual Agenda Leading Practices (G. Segu)

Genevieve Segu presented the Audit Committee Annual Agenda Leading Practices. The list is intended to assist management and Audit Committee members in establishing their annual agenda, in accordance with O.Reg. 361/10.

8.4 <u>2023-24 Strategic Risk Assessment Results OE Region Draft Report (G. Segu)</u>

Genevieve Segu presented the 2023-2024 Strategic Risk Assessment Results OE (Ontario-East) Region Draft Report, outlining a summary of risks and controls in place.

During the discussion and in response to queries, the following points were noted:

- While the District has continually conducted risk assessments, it has not participated in a recent risk assessment benchmark study;
- Key risk areas are identified at the executive level, including attendance management, recruitment and retention, and cybersecurity;
- The Ottawa-Carleton District School Board (OCDSB) has developed a wellness plan for attendance management, and provides training on behaviour management in the classroom; and
- While controls are put in place to manage risk, there are often external unforeseen variables.
