APPROVAL OF THE PROPOSED MERGER OF LEARNING RESOURCES POLICIES

PURPOSE:

1. To seek approval of the proposed merger of Policy P 030 CUR - Learning Media Requiring Approval and Policy P 031 CUR - Learning Resources.

STRATEGIC LINKS:

2. As part of the scheduled policy review, staff assessed whether any related policies could be consolidated to streamline and simplify content for both end users and the public. The proposed amalgamation of the two attached policies aligns with the District's policy review and development process. It supports the principles of "good governance" and "responsible resource use," as outlined in the 2023-2027 Ottawa-Carleton District School Board (OCDSB) Strategic Plan.

CONTEXT:

3. The review of Policy P 030 CUR - Learning Media Requiring Approval and Policy P 031 CUR - Learning Resources revealed substantial overlap in their content. Staff believe maintaining both policies would be redundant and an inefficient use of Board resources. Merging them would streamline the content, making the policies more accessible and user-friendly for staff and the public. To date, there have been no updates to regulations or significant changes in practice relevant to this proposed policy, and as such, the new policy does not propose any major changes to the existing content.

KEY CONSIDERATIONS:

4. Key Revisions

In addition to the revisions highlighted in Report 25-009, the following has been revised in response to the feedback received from trustees and the public.

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- requirement for the District to approve all textbooks and/or classroom learning resources that a school wishes to introduce. Rather, a new 4.3 is added to encourage consultation with partners, where appropriate, and limit the District's approval strictly to textbooks. Future revisions to the procedure will detail the process to be followed for selecting classroom learning resources.
- 4.4 Removed from Guiding Principles and added as a specific directive. Retained the "and" to ensure that all criteria are considered.
- 4.4 (b) "Counter narratives" replaced with "alternate narratives"
- 4.5 Section added to ensure that selected learning resources are reviewed regularly to ensure they remain in compliance with the guiding principles and in alignment with the latest curriculum
- 4.6 The right to appeal the use of a selected learning resource remains, with final reconsideration at the system level with the Director of Education or designate as part of a formal committee to ensure a fair and equitable process. Revisions to the procedure (in progress) will incorporate further details on this process. In addition,

		complaints or expressions of concern can be addressed through the P.129.GOV Complaints Resolution Policy.

5. There are no financial or resource implications relating to the proposed amalgamation of the two policies.

COMMUNICATION/CONSULTATION ISSUES:

- 6. In addition to the feedback received during the Policy Review Committee meeting of 13 February 2025, the proposed merger was posted to Engage OCDSB from 13 February to 14 March 2025. A total of 11 submissions were made with the following themes:
 - Concern around the use of YouTube for kindergartners;
 - Concern around the removal of appeals to trustees; and
 - Questions around the approvals required for resources not listed in Trillium.

Given the procedural nature of the feedback above, revisions to the procedures will be informed by Engage submissions.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

THAT the proposed merger of Policies P 030 CUR and P 031 CUR, attached as Appendix A to Report 25-012, be approved.
